In Class (Instructor)

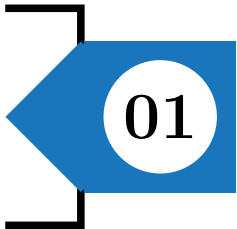


In Class (Students)


Begin Here.

Students are assigned to groups of 6-7 by the instructor; each group is assigned a specific problem which they will complete individually then compile in class.


Individually, students complete an assigned reading, then answer the problem assigned to their group.




Students are instructed to break into their pre-assigned groups.

As a group, students compare and contrast one another's responses to the assigned question. Groups debate, then come to a consensus regarding the correct answer before transcribing their final response onto an interactive board or whiteboard.



Groups move from board to board, reviewing and commenting on the work completed by all other groups (i.e., peer-review/gallery walk).



Groups discuss the comments provided by their peers and decide whether or not to incorporate these comments into their final responses.



Groups compile a final response and submit it to an online learning management system for assessment by the instructor.
