
"The lifelong process by which we learn our culture, develop our personalities, and become functioning members of society" (Ravelli, 98).

Status: a recognizable social position that an individual occupies

****TOIC:** the duties and behaviour expected of someone who holds a particular status.

Sociologists distinguish between two kinds of statuses:

ascribed status: a status into which one is born

→ sets of behavioural norms assumed to accompany one's status as male or female.


But what do we mean by gender?


