This year's theme is **Student Success: Collective Endeavours**. Proposals should explore the theme/sub-themes and how they relate to teaching and learning in the CEGEP context and our pedagogical and institutional practices.

IPD seeks to promote sharing between college educators, foster intercollegiate professional development, and strengthen collaboration between the English-language CEGEPs.

FORMAT

The aim is to offer a rich and diverse program representing faculty and staff from all English CEGEPs. In the spirit of IPD, we encourage you to consider collaborating with colleagues to offer (inter)collegiate and/or (inter)disciplinary sessions.

Workshop

- 60 min or 90 min
- Interactive and practice-based. Indicates specific outcomes.

Roundtable discussion

- 60 min
- Allows for audience participation

Panel

- 60 min or 90 min
- Multiple presenters (e.g., 15 minutes per presenter) followed by a Q&A.

Performance

- 30 min or 60 min
- Includes creative or performative elements followed by a discussion, reflection, or Q&A.

Asynchronous session

- Length to be determined by presenter
- Pre-recorded presentations, tutorials, demonstrations, or performances
- Link to pre-recorded session provided to participants

Considering this year's theme, student panels are welcome (faculty or staff involvement required).
